The tile-clad bar, with its sleek style and attractive brass details, is a central feature acting as a linking unit to the rest of the loft.

In Berlin's cool Kreuzberg neighbourhood, Dittel Architekten has designed an exclusive showroom to satisfy even the most devoted car-lover. Carloft allows you to park your wheels within clear view, in the 'CarLoggia' behind a glass frontage: the car virtually becomes part of the interior, which includes a bar with a lounge for guests and a show area with an adjoining patio.

Getting the car up here is part of the fun – the driver remains seated in the car while it is elevated safely to the loft. It's a formula ideal for parties, photo shoots, city stays (there's a sleeping area) and other events.

An open interior design was implemented in the 230-m² space, allowing the rooms to merge and so form a coherent unity. Walls were removed where possible in order to create a generous and extensive feeling of space. The focal point of the loft is the large bar and kitchen area. The kitchen island is completely clad with anthracite tiles which are combined with attractive brass details to form the heart of the space. This element is an eye-catcher the minute you enter the loft. The bar flows into a spacious lounge area, harmoniously styled with brass again featuring in several details. Adjoining the lounge there is a library and a working area, with a continuous and harmonious flow in the colour palette.

The furniture in the loft space is a mix of classic interior design, built-in aspects and new design elements. Reconditioned antique furniture adds that certain something to the overall view.
